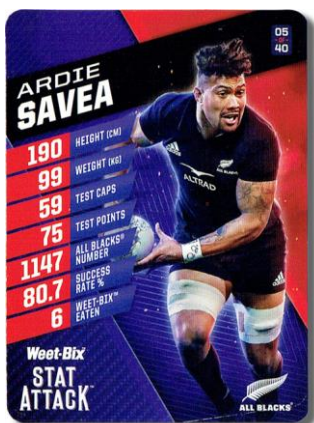

New Issue – Weet-Bix Stat Attack

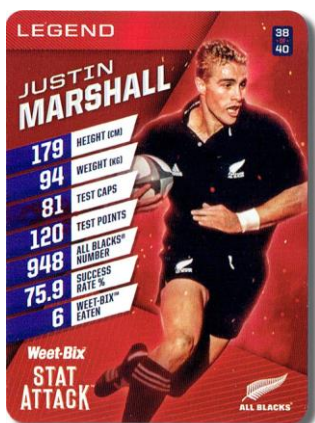
Sanitarium have done it again, another Stat Attack All Blacks rugby card set for 2022. It's a set of 41 Stat Attack cards in the same format as the 2021 card issue (See Cardlines 244 August 2021). The size of each card is 62mm x 85mm and the set comprises 34 current All Blacks, 5 legends, a head coach card and a limited edition (5,000 only) gold Richie McCaw card (see front cover). Once again, the front of each card shows an action shot of the player together with statistics that are used when playing the 'Stat Attack' game.



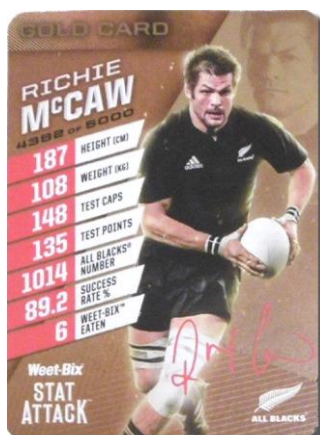

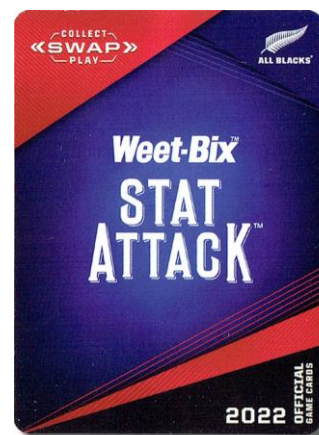

Card back

At the time of writing, I don't know if a special tin or album, in which to house the cards, have or will be issued. Mind you, on the back of the 1.2kg packets of Weet-Bix (Fig 5) there is a box which can be cut out, folded and glued, and used to house the card set. Also, on the side of the 750gm box (Fig 6) there is a checklist card which can be cut out and included in the set.



It's a good-looking set, as Sanitarium sets usually are, but I really do think they might have missed a trick here by not including any of the Black Ferns players. This year, in October and November, is the Women's Rugby World Cup and it's being held in New Zealand. What an awesome way to support the Black Ferns and women's rugby it would have been if Black Ferns players were included in this set. I know from personal experience that these cards are a great way for kids and adults alike to learn the look and names of our top players, so I can't lie and say that I'm not a little bit disappointed to see no Black Ferns players in the set. I'm not sure if this was a decision by Sanitarium, or the NZRFU, who provide the list from which the players can be chosen. But no matter whose decision it was, it remains bewildering.

The postcard album, albeit it being without any individual cards of any great value, is still interesting with half the cards being New Zealand related. They include cards from the popular F.T. Series, Muir and Moody, W.A.P. Color Photographic Series, W.Beattie, Radcliffe & Stewart, Fergusson Ltd, The 'Stanley' Series, A.B. Series, and several different booksellers. Lots of geographical areas covered too; Christchurch, Wellington, Auckland, Eltham, New Plymouth, Oamaru, Rotorua, White Island, Fiji, and more.

Holy Advertising Batman!...By Stephen Summers

Given I've always been a Batman fan, my son and I eagerly awaited the new film when it was released in cinemas in March (aptly named 'The Batman'). It would be fair to say it didn't disappoint, as it took Batman back to what he originally was, namely a detective with an amazing array of gadgets to help him solve crime and fight the bad guys. It was certainly much darker and grittier than a number of previous iterations of the caped crusader, but it worked well, and we both look forward to the next instalment of the story.

Whilst I would rate this film high on the list of the many Batman films released over the last three decades, a recent purchase I made reminded me of an earlier time when a new Batman film also meant Batman card/sticker related items to collect here in New Zealand.

While many collectors are familiar with the two Regina gum card sets in 1989 and the Dynamic Marketing set for Batman Returns in 1992 (which I believe was the first trading card set issued here), 1992 also saw Cadbury get into the act with a Batman chocolate bar (fig 1). In my view, the wrapper is one of the best Cadbury has produced. It has striking colours, with Batman attempting to leap out of the wrapper. Better yet, for card collectors, the back of the wrapper had a Batman logo skin transfer for kids (or even older Batman fans) to proudly show their support for the Dark Knight (fig 2).

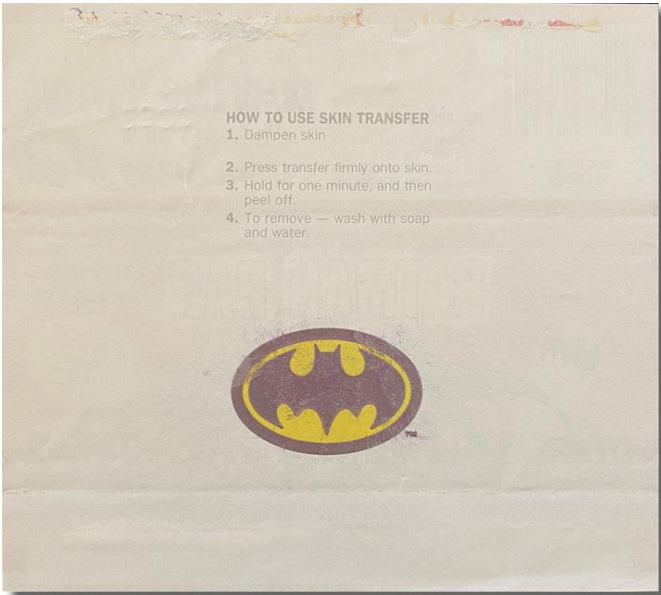

The somewhat strange thing about this wrapper was that it was issued at a time when Cadbury was regularly releasing series of wrappers, not just a single wrapper. The Simpsons wrappers counted no less than 24 wrappers of the main characters, as did both the Farm and Furry Friends series.

Given Cadbury would likely have paid up for the Batman license, it's a pity they didn't include other wrappers of say Batman's arch enemies, or even Batman in different poses. Still, it is what it is, and perhaps Cadbury thought the transfer would be enough to entice kids to buy more bars and place another transfer on themselves or others. There was also a competition to enter, with the promise of great prizes (if anyone ever kept a copy of the entry form mentioned on the wrapper, you'll have a keen buyer!).

Given my fondness for this wrapper, when the opportunity came up recently to purchase something related to it I jumped all over it. To promote the wrapper in stores, Cadbury also produced a die-cut cardboard advertising board that replicated the Batman drawing on the wrapper (*fig 3*). It's not large, measuring approx. 29cm x 27cm, but annoyingly just large enough not to fit in a standard A4 pocket sheet to include with the wrapper in one of my Cadbury card albums.

So, was there anything issued for the latest Batman film? The only thing I could find on the shelves was a special Oreo packet that advertised the biscuits with a limited-edition Batman design (*fig 4*). I bought one and hoped when opening the packet it might have had a transfer or some Batman trivia on the inside, but no such luck. Maybe for the next Batman film...

Tobacco Companies on Postcards...*By Nik Zangouropoulos*

For someone like me who collects certain themes in both postcards and cigarette cards, the concept that the tobacco manufacturers themselves occasionally appear on postcards immediately grabs my eye. Even more so given the rarity with which this happens, usually as advertising postcards with the tobacco company and/or its brand(s) as the subject matter, which is the focus of this article.

The tobacco companies in question (mostly U.S. and British) had been operating for several decades by the time the picture postcard production took hold at the end of the 19th century. The tobacco card phenomenon itself coincided almost exactly with the proliferation of postcards around this time (the *fin de siècle* era).

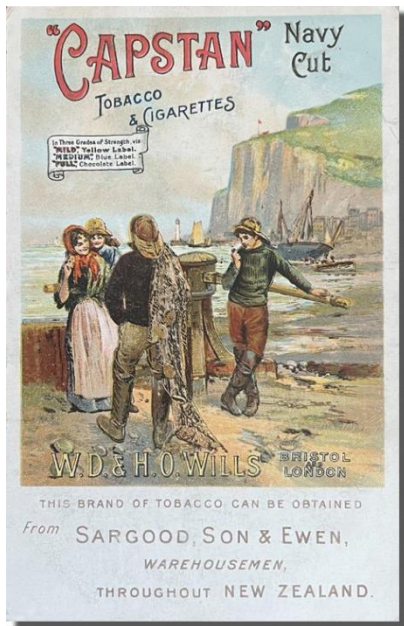
This article was triggered when I discovered that my friend and avid cigarette card collector, Guy Holmes, had a similar fascination for these cards and had a decent number of them. These, together with the handful that I had at the time (now in Guy's collection), provided enough material for the following leisurely sightseeing tour.

1. Wills

The postcards below are from the mega tobacco firm W.D. & H.O. Wills which was based in the English city of Bristol. Wills was the giant of cigarette card makers producing about 465 sets and over 20,000 cards in nearly fifty years until World War II. These postcards are advertising one of its well-known brands "Three Castles", with the additionally interesting factor that they date from very early in the postcard / cigarette card period c.1895 (as per the postmark below right).



Another Three Castles set is connected to the Rotary Photographic Series, a well-known postcard series that featured personalities in their own right, and was not usually connected to any products. It appears that there was a series of 39 such cards with either this brand or Wills' "Vice Regal" brand.



The card to the left also has an interesting dimension – beyond being an attractive period advertising card from Wills. Namely, it has been syndicated through the well-established local importing firm of Sargood, Son and Ewen, which had an extensive network of businesses throughout New Zealand at the beginning of the 20th century.

The Wills related cards (right) are a bit of a mystery. The one on the left has a Timaru blind stamp suggesting that it is just a regular studio photo of a child dressed in a Wills outfit. However, the similar looking card on the right is from a London photographer, creating the possibility that something more co-ordinated and company-related is going on with these postcards. This possibility is all the stronger, given the stringent copyright laws of the time.



2. Ogdens

This postcard is a real beauty – a classic period advertising card of the famous Liverpool cigarette firm Ogdens, whose prominence in the industry is indicated by the by-line “beware of imitations”. This firm was also a mega producer of cigarette cards at the turn of the century, and like Wills pumped out over 20,000 different cards but via a far fewer number of sets. A significant share of their total output came in the long running Ogden’s Guinea Gold real photograph series (whose cigarettes are advertised on the card), as well as the Ogden’s Tabs printed photograph series, both appearing in the first decade of the 20th century.



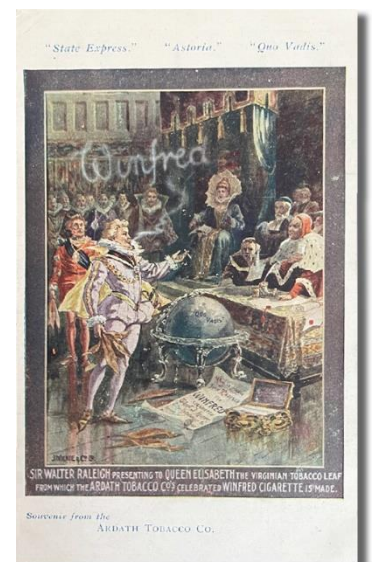
3. Player



This card is similar to the mysterious Wills cards noted earlier, but comes from another major English producer John Player & Sons, based in Nottingham. This similarly well-established company was also a giant cigarette card producer, second only to Wills in number of sets issued at about 265. As with the other major companies, Player had a wide range of advertising material including on cigarette cards themselves, but nothing much has been seen on postcards from this era. The image to the right is exactly how the postcard appears. It’s ‘*crooked postcard within a postcard*’ look really gives it the appearance of being a home-made photo postcard.

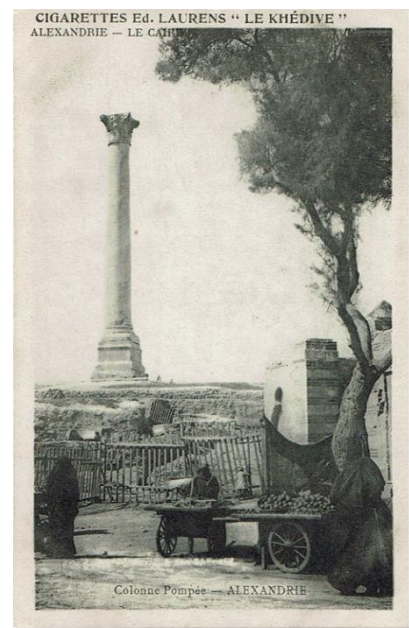
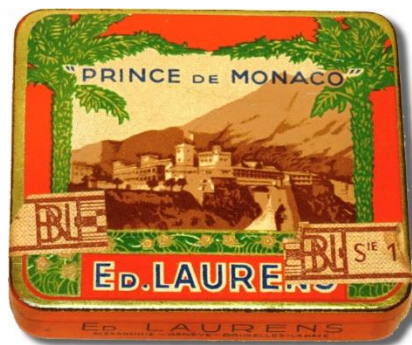
4. Ardath

This postcard is from the London firm of Ardath Tobacco Co. (seventh ranked by number of sets at 110), and appropriately depicts Sir Walter Raleigh presenting Queen Elisabeth with Virginia tobacco leaf, with which the company proudly stakes an association. The firm was a producer of many fine series of cigarette cards and had a significant number of New Zealand issued sets.



5. Ed. Laurens

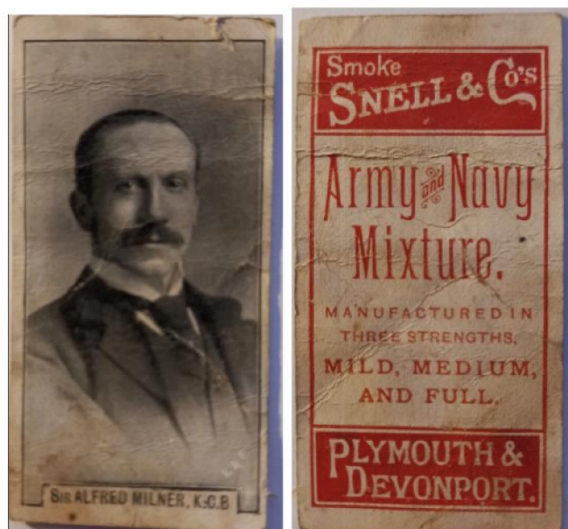
This card is one of many Ed. Laurens issues featuring interesting people, sights and monuments of North Africa. The company operated in various markets such as Egypt (Cairo & Alexandria) and France, and this card is a London & Switzerland version, rather than the Laurens brand belonging to the ATC group. From a wider tobacciana perspective, this company produced a very extensive array of elegant cigarette tins (see example below).



6. Snell

This pleasant card (right) is from Snell & Co., a British firm based in Devonport, Birmingham. Cigarette Card catalogues record only a *Boer War celebrities* – “*STEW*” set from c.1901, so this is very much a boutique company and card. Furthermore, the catalogue price of £260 per card makes it very boutique indeed!

As coincidence would have it, as I was writing this article, the card below came up on Ebay and I managed to acquire it quite cheaply as it's not in great condition. As a bonus it had the neighbouring photo and blurb (over page) attached.



Not much is known about the owners, Plymouth historian Chris Robinson revealed about Snell & Co, which had shops all over the city, was a tobacconist. “They also sold high class confectionery,” he said, “two things which are now the antithesis of health.” In an old advert found online, Snell & Co described its business as selling “high-class pipes, pouches, lighters, cigarette cases, cigars, tobacco and cigarettes – in fact, all smokers’ requisites”. The tobacco sellers also had branches at Mutley Plain, New George Street and Cornwall Street.

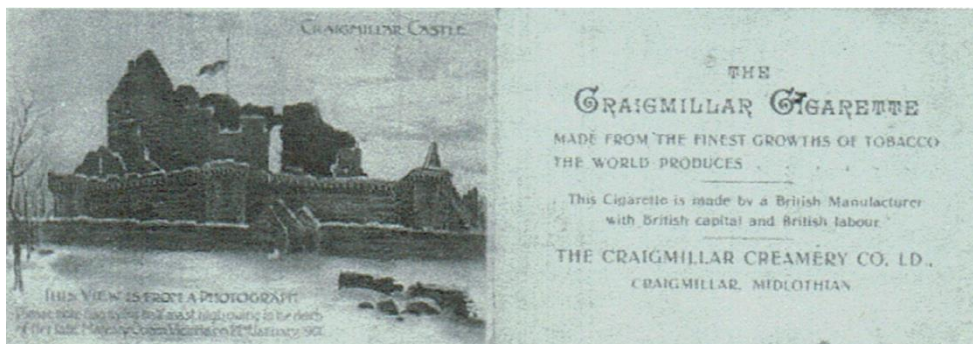
7. Craigmillar Creamery

The card below left shows a 1911 visit by King George V to Edinburgh, Scotland near the Midlothian home of the Craigmillar Creamery Company, the producers of Craigmillar Cigarettes. The card below right is postally used with an early 1912 postmark. Both of these cards appear to have been used by the company’s sales representatives based on the quaint message on the reverse of the cards:

Dear Sir, We beg to advise you that our Mr will have the pleasure of calling on you on or about when your favours will be much esteemed. Yours truly, The Craigmillar Creamery Co. Ld.

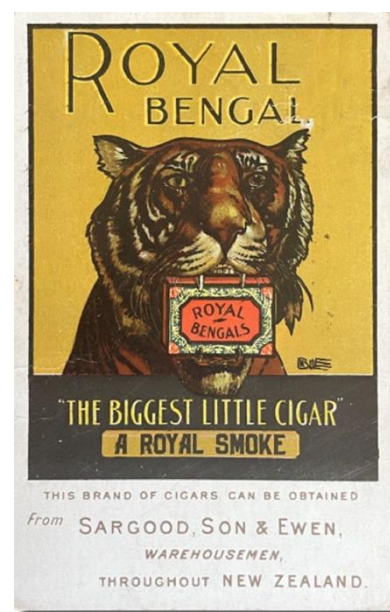
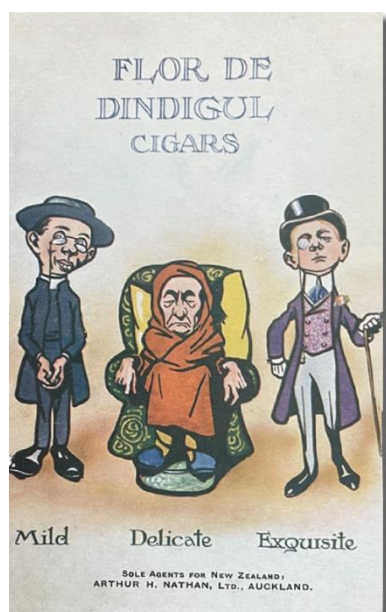


Interestingly, this company produced exactly one single cigarette card around 1901 (see below from the World Trade Index) referred to as *Views of Craigmillar*, with the eye-watering current catalogue value of £1,300!



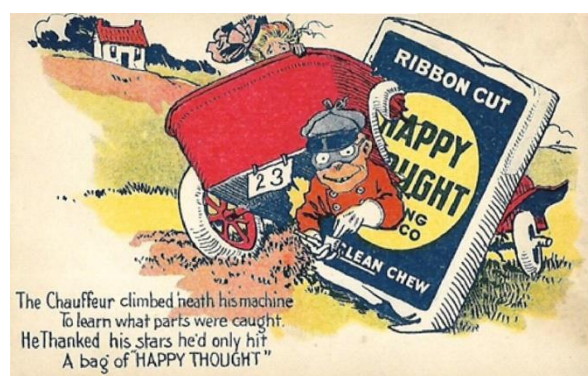
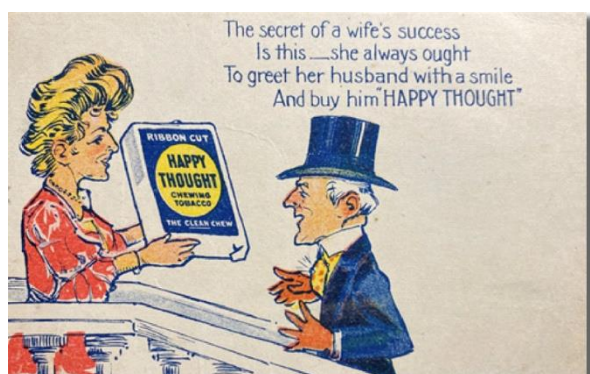
8. Cigar Manufacturers

The two cards below were also syndicated to New Zealand importing companies – the Sargood company previously mentioned and the firm of Arthur H. Nathan. The card on the left is from Bewley & Co., and advertises the “Flor De Dindigul” brand – a fine cigar, often accompanied by fine artwork and advertising. The second card is from the famed cigarette card producer, the eponymous American Tobacco Company, here marketing its Royal Bengals brand. This company produced a number of cigarette cards under this brand such as *T68 - Heroes of History*.



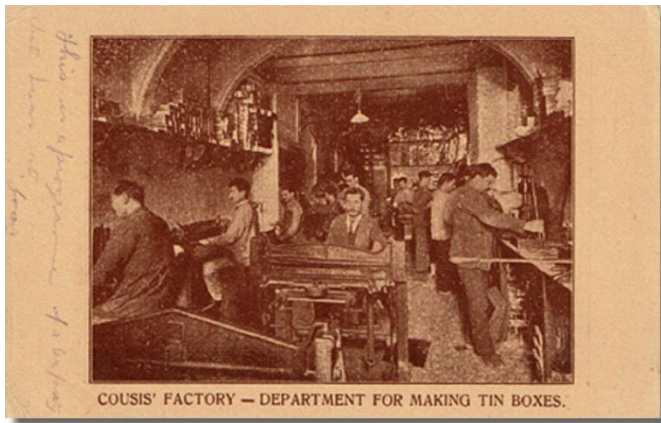
9. Wilson and McCallay

The cards below are examples of a number of similar postcards produced by the American Company Wilson & McCallay, the producer of Happy Thought cigarettes. This company produced appears to have produce only series of cigarette cards - 7 cabinet sized tobacco premiums *N562 - Art Gems*.



We have now come to the end of this brief tour of tobacco firms advertising on postcards, but before we close, mention should be made of other tobacco themes on postcards.

The fascinating postcard (right) is from France during a period of tobacco shortage (or “crisis” according to the card), around the beginning of World War I. It suggests that smoking is not the be all and end all of everything, and that other distractions are equally worthy. The rough translation is “lighting a fag is an exquisite thing, but my mouth prefers another thrill”. It is interesting that the tobacco company/product featured is the English giant Wills, possibly reflecting a mischievous mix of anti-capitalism and xenophobia?!



The card to the left shows the Maltese company A.S. Cousis & Co. in the process of creating the product in question. This company was also a major producer of cigarette cards in the first quarter of the 20th century. Its total output of about 10,000 cards was heavily weighted towards actresses and personalities of the day.

Finally, to end with, a nice little French card I acquired recently off Delcampe with following captures: little boys saying to even smaller girl – Would you like a cigarette? No thanks, comes the reply, I gave up two years ago!

The grab below is from an auction site that was selling tobacco themed postcards and gives a flavour of various other tobacco themes appearing on mostly vintage postcards.

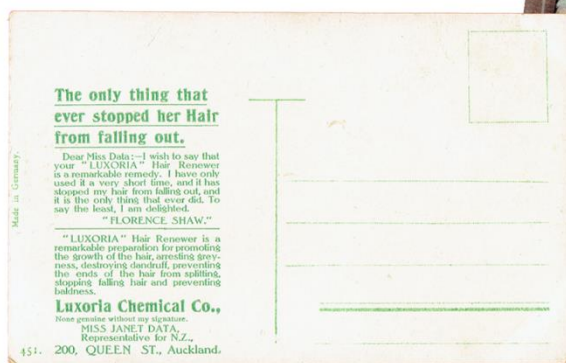


Trade Card, Postcard or a Simple Hybrid?

Clearly this is a postcard, with its address field and area where a stamp can be affixed. But, in this instance, half of the reverse is also dedicated to advertising “Luxoria” Hair Renewer, a product from the Luxoria Chemical Co, which seemed to be a remarkable remedy for preventing baldness, preventing hair from splitting and destroying dandruff.

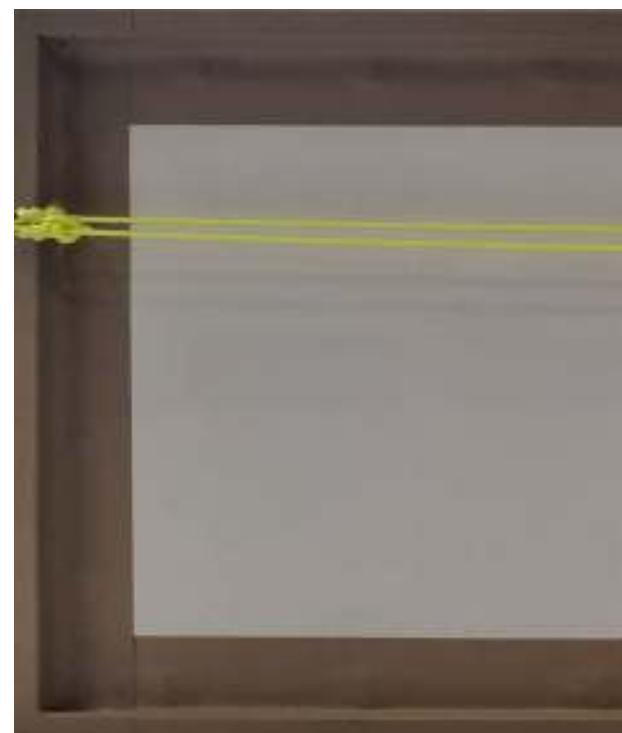

But do hard core NZ trade card collectors consider this card worthy of chasing?



In 2001 Sanitarium produced a 15-card set entitled *'All Blacks 1000 Strong 1903-2001'*. The set was to celebrate the centenary of the All Blacks in June 2001. The cards were double sided, with the front showing a current All Blacks player, with the back showing a historical All Blacks player. The back of the cards doesn't appear in the set. Of course, most collectors will be familiar with this set, but many will be unaware of the 20 (110 x 156mm) cards entitled *'How Many Can You Do?'*. These cards were handed out to fans at various All Blacks events. The cards featured five players: Allan Kelleher, Christian Cullen and Tana Umaga, each of them showing the number of Weet-Bix he can eat. The cards were also included in the 20 individually numbered, signed and framed mini posters featuring the same five players. The frame pictures

I don't know how these framed pictures were given out but suspect they were given to suppliers or clients of Sanitarium. Perhaps each of the five players were also given one? It would be interesting to know if any more of these are in the hands of collectors. Has anyone else seen or got one?



1 How Many Can You Do?

Celebrate the capping of the 1,000th All Blacks player. It was Carl Hayman, who debuted against Samoa on 16 June 2007, showing an All Blacks great from the past. Ironically, although the 1,000th All Blacks player, Hayman was not the first of the other All Blacks card set Sanitarium issued that same year. It was a set of five blank-backed larger All Blacks training sessions held throughout the country. They feature Anton Oliver, Greg Somerville, Byron Oliver, and Carl Hayman. These cards are very rare and can seldom be found. But just as rare, if not rarer and even more unknown, are the cards that feature these players holding stacks of Weet-Bix. These cards are even more rare and are even more unknown, as they are even more scarce. Each card measures approximately 62 x 22cm.



2022 AGM Report and Card Show...*By Stephen Summers*

It would be fair to say I was unexpectedly thrust into the role of head organiser for the AGM at the start of the year. However, I decided that a heads down, tails up policy was the best course of action to ensure the Wellington AGM made the most of the increased interest in all types of collectable cards over the last few years.

Given the format of last year's AGM in Christchurch seemed to work well, we continued it for Wellington. This involved having the formal AGM and dinner on the Saturday afternoon/evening, then a full day of trading on the Sunday.

The formal AGM meeting on the Saturday afternoon was – in the best possible way - largely uneventful as we now have a settled committee and a new President to provide some fresh ideas and perspectives (congrats John!). Once that was out of the way, you never have to ask card collectors twice for an opportunity to buy some cards early on. Members swooped to both Eric Diamond's stock as well as a few boxes of cigarette cards the Society had on offer given these tables had been set up early. Faced with the difficult choice of going through cards or popping off to the Newlands Arms for a pre-dinner drink, cards held the upper hand for quite a while.



However, most eventually did make it to the pub for one quick drink before heading to Chilli's restaurant for dinner at 6.30pm.

While a traditional Indian cuisine was enjoyed by all, we wondered whether the staff were trying their best to break the New Zealand record for the slowest serving of dinner ever, as we didn't receive our mains till closer to 9pm. Although it gave all of us more of a chance to catch up and tell some really cool card stories, we were fairly close to eating the tablecloths for sustenance by the time the food came out.

Despite getting home much later than we originally thought, our esteemed editor Mr McCullough (who was staying at Hotel Summers over the weekend) and I still decided to get on the newly opened Transmission Gully for a very early start on the Sunday, arriving around 7.15am so everything was all ready for the hordes of sellers to turn up from 8am onwards.



The day begins

Before the Sunday, I mentioned to a number of members that our main day of trading was going to be different in a few ways. First off, I marketed it as the New Zealand Card Show. Card events overseas are typically referred to as Shows, so thought it would be useful if we followed suit. Also, I decided to start the marketing/advertising campaign for the Show two months before, which involved significant coverage on Facebook and other social media channels, along with event/community websites and even community radio announcements. That's not to say more traditional ways of advertising weren't used, as a number of gaming store/collector stores in the Wellington region were happy to put up a poster for the Show in their store, as well as hand out flyers. All up, I wanted no stone unturned in terms of getting the word out there about our big day.



The other thing that was a bit different from previous years was that the event included a significant number of non-members sellers who had seen my ads and wanted to be part of the Show. For the day we ended up with close to 40 tables of cards, with the mix of members and non-members meaning there was a great range of cards to buy, including types of cards we rarely seen at usual club swap meets (see Covert Art page 5). Many of us are used to the standard collector cards, but gaming cards such as Pokemon and Magic the Gathering have equally devoted followings, which help bring in many younger collectors. Also, certain sports cards such as basketball cards and UFC have massive followings by card collectors, so including them was a must.

I think all organisers have that fear in the back of their mind of what if the public doesn't turn up? However, I was very pleasantly surprised at the strong presence by the public right throughout the day.

There were specialist collectors, associated collectors, plenty of families with kids and those just wanting to relive some nostalgia and check out what cards are out there to collect. We had a number wanting valuations, and even a pair of entrepreneurial kids who were buying from some tables then on-selling the cards at a higher amount at their impromptu table (love the hustle kids!).

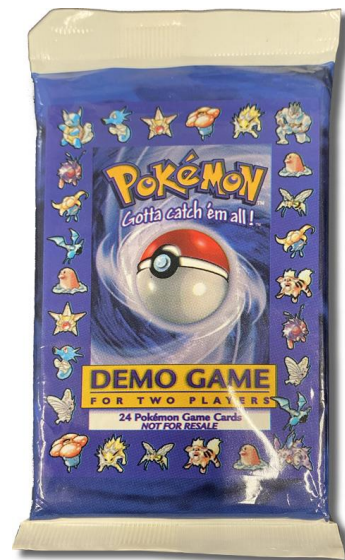

By all accounts everyone enjoyed themselves. So much so in fact that general consensus was that we should again have the Show in Wellington in 2023. However, we'll likely look for a bigger venue given the strong demand for tables.

After we wrapped up for the day, got the venue back to what it looked like before the Show and dropped off Justin to the airport to head back to Christchurch, my beer tasted pretty good by the time I got home. Whew!
